OUR MISSIONS



Since the flooding disaster in the Hudson Highlands on July 9th near West Point, the Conference has been busy with the call to help the survivors. The call went out to collect bottled water and flood buckets. The UMC of Mt. Kisco volunteered to become a drop-off point for these donations. To date we have collected and delivered to the area over 150 cases of water. The flood buckets have also been accumulating. We received a donation of 100 flood buckets from Jesse Lee UMC in Ridgefield and 50 buckets from the Hudson Valley Parish. Our own church was able to assemble and re-assemble over 75 buckets, with the help of donations from Yorktown UMC. The Conference, and especially the people affected by the flooding, are grateful for al of these donations.

We are part of the Northern Westchester Cooperative, which is not taking any autonomy from our church, just has us joined with 10 other small community churches. What is Harvest Host?



We have become a Host Site for Harvest Hosts. This is a network of overnight sites that assist people who are traveling with campers and mobile homes to find a safe place to park their camper at the end of the day. They have over 4800 hosts registered in their data base. It lets the traveler map out their trip and look at the places they'll be traveling through. Traveling members answer a brief questionnaire and it matches them up with a location that best fits their needs, We do not pay for being part of this service the traveler pays to belong to Harvest Host and at the end of their stay they have the opportunity to donate to our church. We provide them with information of activities and restaurants in the area. They contact us to see if we have an opening for their date. If we do, we approve their stay.
